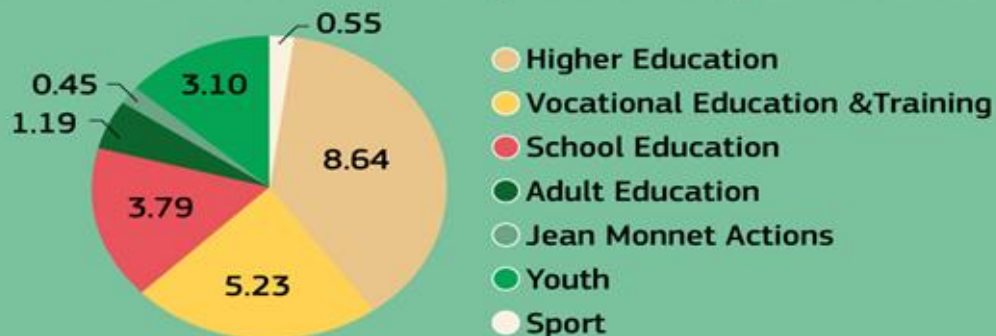

Since its launch in 1987, Erasmus has enabled 19 million people to study, train, volunteer and gain professional experience abroad. For the future Erasmus programme, which will run from 2021 to 2027, the European Commission is proposing to double its budget to 30 billion. This would enable 22 million people to participate in the programme, three times the number currently able to participate.
