

 - KA2 <u>Capacity Building</u> in Higher Education in <u>Partner</u> <u>Countries</u>
- Jean Monnet programme





Erasmus+: Programme & Partner Countries

- Erasmus+ PROGRAMME countries (33):
 - 28 European Union (EU) Member States
 - 3 Member States of the European Economic Area (EEA)
 - Iceland, Norway and Liechtenstein
 - 2 EU Candidate Countries Turkey, FYR of Macedonia
- Erasmus+ <u>PARTNER countries</u> other countries than Erasmus+ programme countries <u>defined</u> concretely for the particular Activity
- N.B. for all Erasmus+ activities Erasmus+ programme countries' HEIs must hold eligible Erasmus Charter for Higher Education

decentralised (National Agency)





International Mobility - Basic principles

- Core of the Activity <u>students and staff mobility</u> between:
 - Erasmus+ <u>programme</u> countries and
 - Erasmus+ partner countries
- The Activity foresees both directions' mobility incoming and outgoing (specific rules of each of 4 EU Financial Instruments must be observed)





International Mobility - Project Applicant

- Project Applicant for the International Credit Mobility is:
 - <u>1 Higher Education Institution</u> (or Mobility Consortium) from the <u>Erasmus+ Programme Country</u>
 - Erasmus+ programme countries' HEIs <u>must hold eligible</u>
 <u>Erasmus Charter for Higher Education</u> (ECHE)
- Each Erasmus+ programme country <u>HEI can submit</u>
 1 application per call
- Erasmus+ Partner country HEI cannot submit the application





International Mobility - Project Partner

- At least 1 Higher Education Institution from the eligible Erasmus+ Partner Country must be involved
- Erasmus+ Partner Countries' HEIs must observe and apply the rules defined in the ECHE (laid out in the Interinstitutional Partnership Agreement):

(before – Erasmus Mundus Action 1a)
Centralised (EACEA),

started in Call 2014





Joint Masters - Basic Principles (1)

- Integrated international master programmes of excellent quality to attract the best students worldwide
- Developed & delivered by a consortium of HEIs from at least 3 Programme countries
- Duration 12 18 24 months (60 90 120 ECTS)
- One preparatory year + 3 intakes (5 years maximum) covered by 1 Grant agreement
- Mandatory study period in at least 2 different Programme countries
- Award of fully recognised joint or multiple degree
- N.B. Implementation of the accredited Master Programme is financed, but not its preparation!





Joint Masters - Basic Principles (2)

- Joint degrees encouraged but not mandatory (double/multiple degrees still eligible)
- Worldwide visibility
- Bridging academic and job-market needs (trans-disciplinary approach)
- Employability of graduates emphasized
- Sustainability after EU funding ensured
- Additional scholarships available for certain regions



Capacity Building - Objectives

- Objectives of the action:
 - Support the development / modernisation / reform of higher education in Partner Countries
 - Promote cooperation between Europe and Partner Countries (as well as among Partner Countries)
 - **Promote** voluntary **convergence with EU developments** in the higher education
 - Promote people-to-people contacts, intercultural awareness and understanding





Capacity Building - Main Principles

• 5 main principles:

- Targets: institutions and systems rather than individuals (not directly a mobility action)
- Relevance to needs of Partner countries/institutions
- International cooperation as a mean (exchange of experience & practice, peer learning despite of diversity)
- Bottom-up approach (voluntary process, grass root initiatives, creating innovation hubs)
- Emphasis put on institutional cooperation (institutional commitment, structural & sustainable impact)





Capacity Building - Priorities

- Projects have to observe Partner Countries' priorities (national/regional and horizontal):
 - <u>National Projects</u> institutions from 1 Partner Country involved
 - <u>Multi-country Projects</u> institutions from at least 2 Partner Countries involved
- List of Partner Countries' priorities published on the EACEA web-site together with the actual Call documentation





Capacity Building – Partner Countries

- ~ 150 Partner Countries in this Activity:
 - Eastern Europe and Southern Mediterranean countries
 - Russian Federation
 - Western Balkans
 - Asia and Central Asia
 - Middle East* & South Africa
 - Latin America
 - ACP countries

Capacity Building – Types of Projects

- 2 types of the Projects:
 - 1) **Joint Projects** (operate at micro level and <u>target</u> <u>higher education institutions</u> in the eligible Partner Countries);
 - 2) **Structural Projects*** (operate at macro level and target national higher education systems and policies in the eligible Partner Countries).
- additional Special Mobility Strand (for students and staff exchanges) available (for concrete regions), but not obligatory – to be prepared as separate application

^{*}N.B. responsible branch (HE) ministry of the Partner Country has to be involved



Capacity Building - Partnership

Composition of partnership:

- Projects may involve one or more Partner Countries
 (from the same or different regions) with at least 2 HEIs
 each
- Projects must involve at least 3 different Programme
 Countries (3 HEIs)
- At least as many Partner Countries HEIs as Programme Countries HEIs





Capacity Building – Types of Activities

3 main topics:

- Curriculum development activities
- Reform of university governance and management
- Strengthening relations between HE and the wider socio-economic environment

Main activities:

- Training, lecturing
- Study visits
- Meetings & conferences
- Publications, text books
- Design of procedures / methodologies, etc.





Capacity Building - Length & Funding

- Length of the project:
 - 2 or 3 years
- Level of the grant:
 - between **0.5** and **1 Million** Euros per project
- The grant is intended to support the costs related to the implementation of the project:
 - Staff costs (max. 40%)
 - Travel costs and costs of stay
 - Equipment costs (only for Partner Countries' HEIs (max. 30%))
 - Subcontracting (max. 10%)

Jean Monnet – Main Objectives

- Equip students and young professionals with knowledge of European Union subjects relevant for their academic and professional lives and enhance their civic skills
- Stimulate teaching and research on the European Union
- Foster the dialogue between the European Union and the world in Higher Education (<u>programme</u> <u>open to whole world</u>)





Jean Monnet - Actions

- Modules: short teaching programme in the field of European Union studies
- Chairs: teaching posts with a specialisation in EU studies for university professors or senior lecturers
- Centres of Excellence: focal points of competence and knowledge on European Union subjects
- Networks and Projects: activities to support innovation, cross-fertilisation and spread of EU content
- Institutions and Associations: contribute to the study and dissemination of the EU integration process

Strategic Partnerships – Basic Principles (1)

- Strategic Partnerships in HE must focus on activities designed to improve HE provision across the participating countries:
 - developing, testing and implementing innovative approaches and practices for study programmes, students, staff and organisations;
 - facilitating the recognition and certification of skills and competences;
 - training, teaching and learning activities such as intensive study programmes, blended mobility of students, joint staff training events, and teaching and training assignments.



Strategic Partnerships – Basic Principles (2)

- Strategic Partnership Consortium:
 - minimum of three partners from three different Programme Countries, including the applicant organisation
 - the number of partners and funding will vary depending on the project's aims and activities

Knowledge Alliances – Basic Principles (1)

Knowledge Alliances:

- transnational, structured and result-driven projects, notably between higher education and business
- open to any discipline, sector and to cross-sectoral cooperation
- the partners share common goals and work together towards mutually beneficial results and outcomes
- target the cooperation between organisations established in Programme Countries





Knowledge Alliances – Basic Principles (2)

- Examples of <u>activities</u>:
 - Boosting innovation in higher education, business and in the broader socio-economic environment
 - Developing entrepreneurship mind-set and skills
 - Stimulating the flow and exchange of knowledge between higher education and enterprises
- Consortium requirements:
 - minimum of six independent organisations from at least three Programme Countries
 - out of which there must be at least two higher education institutions and two enterprises

Erasmus+ Qualitative Evaluation Criteria

- Usually 4 qualitative evaluation/award criteria are applied:
 - Relevance of the Project
 - Quality of the Project Design and Implementation
 - Quality of the Project Team and the Co-operation Arrangements
 - Impact and Dissemination
- Points to be allocated per award criterion as well as accents in different chapters of the project application in each of the activities can differ

Erasmus+ Key Action 3

- KA3 the activities in support of policy reform:
 - are targeted at the achievement of the goals of the Europe 2020 strategy
 - in the framework for European cooperation in education and training (ET 2020)
- KA3 usually centralised calls for proposals





Examples of Key Action 3 (1)

- Example of KA3 support (EC Erasmus+ Work Programme 2014, ref. 3.55) – <u>higher education</u>:
 - Initiative to support the implementation of EHEA
 (European Higher Education Area) reforms (continuation for National Team of Bologna Experts' activities) –
 applied/implemented by Erasmus+ National
 Authorities (responsible branch ministries)
- Publication <u>COMPENDIUM 2014</u> is <u>dedicated to</u>
 the <u>projects awarded in 2014</u> under the centralised actions of the Key Action 3: Support to the
 Implementation of the EHEA Reforms

Erasmus+ Call's timing

- Usually the annual Erasmus+ Call is announced in Autumn (~October)
- Application deadlines in Spring of the next year (~February – April (usually differ for Key Actions))
- Currently no calls open for KA1, KA2 higher education sectors
- Actual Calls for KA3 please, <u>follow News'</u> <u>information on EC/EACEA web-sites</u>
- Applications to be submitted using an eForm with attachments – specific requirements for each Activity must be checked
