PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Objectives

- 1. Exchange in maximum 15 staff members and 25 students are sent from the Heimerer College to the international partners, whereas 25 staff members and 35 students from the latter at the former, in any of the academic programs available, during the academic year 2018.
- 2. Prepare at maximum 30 graduates in therapeutic sciences during the time period of 2018-2019.
- 3. Provide missing therapeutic health services for 750-1000 patients during the time period of 2018-2019, based on the multi-disciplinary approach and latest technology.
- 4. Develop the legal framework of Kosovo for health regulated professions based on the respective EU directives during 2018.
- 5. Develop the informative and research infrastructure in the area of EU Health and Immigration Policy during the time period of 2018-2019

Activities

- Sign at least three Inter-institutional agreements between Programme and Partner countries with institutions of higher education from the former countries and the Heimerer College
- 2. A. Lead by the Programme partners, design the curricula of the respective master programs, in line with the criteria of the Bologna system of education and Kosovar criteria set by the National Accreditation Agency
 - B. Jointly ensure the accreditation and delivery of the program.
- 3. Establish a Multi-disciplinary Health Center for advancing the cooperation between therapeutic professionals and students of different disciplines with each other while offering therapeutic health services to patients of vulnerable groups, especially.
- 4. Develop/Harmonize standards of health regulated profession based on the EU respective directives.
- 5. Establish an Excellence Center at the campus of the Heimerer College.



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Results

- 1. At minimum 40 staff members and 60 students are exchanged between the Heimerer College and three institutions of higher education from Programme countries.
- 2. A. At least one Master of Science program is accredited in one of the respective areas for at least time period of 2018-2019.
 - B. At maximum 30 graduates in the respective program in therapeutic sciences graduate by 2019.
- 3. A. A self-sustainable multi-disciplinary health center is established, at the campus of the Heimerer College with the capacity to serve at maximum 550 patients per year.
 - B. At maximum 1000 patients are offered therapeutic health care services, during the two-year time period of 2018-2019.
 - C. Training modules on multidisciplinary diagnosis and assessment of patients are designed and delivered by Consortium partner, guided by the partners from the Programme countries D. Relevant equipment are made available.
- 4. A. Professional standards of nurses, speech therapist and occupational therapist are developed and adopted at the national level.
- A. The Excellence Center of EU Policy of Health and Immigration is established and integrated into the national schemes of policy-making and relevant research infrastructure.
 B. At least 4 workshops on health and immigration policy of EU are organized per year.
 C. Two separate comparative studies on policies in the area of health (health access) and immigration policy at EU level are conducted and published.
 - D. At least two campaigns on EU values, governance and institutions are organized per year.
