

Practicalities

Period of placement:

One year (can be extended for another year).

Start date:

Between 1 August and 1 September.

College:

The trainee must attend a two-week course at AABC during the year at your company (no costs involved for your company).

Salary:

The equivalent of a local trainee salary depending on the trainee's skills.

Holiday:

20-25 days per employment year.

Insurance:

The trainee must be covered by your company's industrial injury insurance and its employee's liability policy.

Accommodation:

The trainees are responsible for finding their own accommodation.

Language skills:

English – some have knowledge of German, French and/or Spanish.

Line of profession:

Commercial assistant specialising in sales, purchasing or logistics.

Clerical assistant specialising in administration.
